Chad Carroll, 1320 Laurel Street, Sulphur, LA, the applicant, stated that they had been operating since August 15, 2022, as an AirBnb, but he now wanted to use it as a short-term rental, and it would allow four cars per unit. Doug Burguières stated the city is looking into an amnesty program, but one was not in place at that time. Councilman Marks wanted to defer to discuss the standards of a short-term rental for mixed-use districts. Robin Basone, 5525 Swift Plant Road, Lake Charles, LA stated that someone from the Planning & Zoning Commission was against it due to minor repairs that were not done.
